#### 1.0 Overcrowding

\* Numbers <u>must not exceed</u> the maximum pool loading i.e. No more than <u>twelve</u> persons in the water at any one time (including staff.)

#### 2.0 <u>Disorderly behaviour (including assault)</u>

- \* Any person causing disruption must be removed from the water immediately. Such removal will be lead by the Life Guard.
- \* A verbal record of all incidents must be filed with the Head Teacher/Senior Leadership Team & line manager and a written record files on CPOMS.

#### 3.0 Lack of Water Clarity

- \* It must be possible to see the pool floor for safety reasons.
- \* If the pool water is cloudy, the pool **must not be used**.
- \* Report to site manager and Senior Leadership team.
- \* The water quality must be checked before swimming resumes.

#### 4.0 Outbreak of Fire

- \* Sound the alarm (one by fire exit).
- \* Radio the main school for help.
- \* Reception to call fire brigade.
- \* Life Guard to give three loud blasts on the whistle as the signal to evacuate the pool.
- \* Life Guard to take charge and give direct instructions.
- \* Follow the evacuation procedure for the class involved.
- \* Provide a foil cloak/blanket for all bathers. Found by front door and emergency exit.
- \* Assemble all staff and pupils from the pool in the entrance lobby to the main school building.
- \* The Life Guard to check the building before leaving to ensure everyone has left.
- \* Life Guard to report that the pool and adjoining areas are empty.
- \* The swimming instructor/lifeguard to call the roll and detail an adult to report to the school office.
- \* Any missing persons will be reported to the Head Teacher/SLT/**Fire Marshall** immediately.

#### 5.0 **Bomb Threat**

- \* Evacuate the building in the approved manner.
- \* Proceed as for an outbreak of fire.

#### 5.1 Lockdown

- \* Lockdown will be indicated via the emergency radio (frequency 7)
- \* Lockdown will be either code red Full lockdown or code amber Partial lockdown
- Follow school procedures for lockdown as appropriate

#### 6.0 Lighting failure

- \* Emergency lighting will automatically switch on.
- \* Evacuate the building.
- \* Proceed as for an outbreak of fire.

#### 7.0 Structural Failure

- \* Evacuate the building in the approved manner.
- \* Proceed as for an outbreak of fire.

#### 8.0 Emission of toxic gases

- \* Evacuate the building in the approved manner.
- \* Proceed as for an outbreak of fire.

#### 9.0 Serious injury to a Bather

- \* Spotter on side to get swimming instructor/lifeguard shout & signal.
- \* Radio main school for help.
- \* Life Guard carries out rescue and initiates other emergency action as appropriate, for example:
  - a) Initiate calling 999 or 112
  - b) Evacuation
  - c) Resuscitation/Cardiac Compression.
- Nother staff to assist rescue as dictated by the lifeguard.

# A '999 or 112' CALL CAN BE MADE FROM THE TELEPHONE IN THE ENTRANCE LOBBY. THE SCHOOL NURSE CAN BE CONTACTED BY DIALLING 22/EMERGENCY RADIO CHANNEL 7

10.0 **Faeces and vomit in swimming pools** must be prevented as far as possible. Any person who has been ill in this way shall only be allowed to use the pool in accordance with current medical guidance.

#### 11.0 Extremes of Temperature

\* There will be no swimming if the air temperature reaches 90 degrees Fahrenheit or over.

#### 12.0 Soiling in the pool

Pool to be evacuated & Site Manager to be notified so the pool can be backwashed. If solid & contained in nappy swimming can continue.

#### 13.0 Foreign Object in Pool

Pool to be closed until pool cleaned. Once safe /object removed swimming can continue.

#### 14.0 <u>Illness / injury to staff</u>

Contact Reception via phone or radio for immediate assistance / first aider.
