#### **PUPIL VOICE - OUR ENVIRONMENT**

This half term Brays Parliament had a visit from Darran Carter who works for the Waste Investigations Support & Enforcement Ltd (WISE) was established in 2020 and has since partnered with over forty local authorities across the UK, delivering bespoke Environmental Enforcement and are the main providers of Environmental Enforcement Officers in the UK.

Darran met out Parliament and worked with Brays school to create a presentation on the importance of managing waste, recycling and keeping our world free of litter.

Parliament members, inspired by the presentation took part in a litter picking activity around the school, we were amazed at how much litter and plastic there was outside our own school and are reminded if the importance of managing waste.


### **ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION - ENERGY SPARKS**



TAs part of our personal development education we are committed to supporting our children to become change makers in climate education. We hosted a workshop from Energy Sparks. As a legacy from our attendance at YESFest, this workshop allowed our children to engage in hands-on learning about energy efficiency and sustainability in an accessible way. Led by the knowledgeable James from Energy Sparks, the children went on exciting "heat hunt" around the school. They identified areas where we are losing heat, gaining valuable insights into how we can improve our school's energy efficiency. We need some more double paned glass in certain areas!

The children applied their learning from the Understanding the World curriculum by creating solar-powered circuits.

#### HARUN & FAIZAN FIND GLOBAL FAME


How incredible that Harun and Faizan feature in a global music video released on the 14th February which is a song and video sharing our love for planet Earth and a call to action to take care of it.

We'll miss your dedication, your friendly face, Thank you, dear Dave, you've left a warm trace. As you embark on new ventures ahead, Know you're cherished here, and in our hearts, you'll tread.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

When the weather outside is cold and wet, we can start to think about holidays and warmer days! It is important to remember that the Government published 'Working together to improve school attendance' in August 2024, which is statutory guidance for schools. The guidance is clear that school CANNOT authorise holidays during school term time.

I'm a single parent of one child and we want to go on a holiday for a week.

Your holiday will not be authorised and you must talk to the school before you book anything. Your child will miss 5 days of school and given a penalty notice fine. The fine is £160 but it you pay it in 21 days it will be reduced to £80.

2 For every child a penalty of £160 is given.

Irregular attendance 10 in 10 If your child is absent for 10 or

more sessions in 10 weeks and their absences are unauthorised. The school will consider prosecution.

1 day = 2 sessions

4 children & 1 parent = £640 Reduced to £320 if paid in 21 days.

4 children & 2 parents = £1280 Reduced to £640 if paid in 21 days.

If in any period of not more than 3 years, your child has a 2nd and 3rd leave of absence or pattern of irregular attendance...

#### 2nd Time

1 child = £320 2 children = £640 3 children = £960 4 children = £1280 No discount for early payment

#### 3nd Time

A penalty notice fine will not be given. Instead, your case will be taken to court. Magistrate can fine each parent £2500 for each child.

1 parent & 4 children = £10 000 2 parent & 4 children = £20 000
