ROALD DAHL DAY

CREATIVE SPACE - THE BODY

It's been a great start to the year in the Creative Space where we have been learning about our bodies. It has been wonderful to welcome lots of new children into the school and to see everyone working together.

First we looked at how bones join together to make skeletons. Then we rolled red balls down pipes in the same way that blood goes around the body, and all the children felt the vibrations of a heartbeat in a massive heart.

Then we showed how muscles are stretchy and twangy, just like elastic and guitar strings, and made patterns with light, playing special musical instruments at the same time.

Lastly we looked at faces and got dressed up ready to watch different photos of all the children in the school.

BLACK HISOTRY MONTH & SHOW RACISM THE RED CARD

On Friday 17th October, Brays Special School proudly took part in Show Racism the Red Card by holding a non-school uniform day, raising over £70 for this vital cause. Racism is a topic we take very seriously at Brays, as it connects deeply with our core value of **#equality**—teaching our children to treat everyone with **#respect and #kindness**, regardless of the colour of their skin.

This event was part of our wider work during Black History Month, where children explored the lives and achievements of inspirational Black individuals. However, we firmly believe that celebrating diversity and promoting equality should not be confined to one month. Throughout the year, we ensure children access diverse resources and stories because representation matters—you can't be what you can't see.

In classes, learning took many creative forms. Some children discovered the story of Levi Roots and expressed their learning through multimedia artwork. Meanwhile, our Clever Cubs class created beautiful portraits inspired by the artist Bisa Butler, celebrating Black culture and creativity.

At Brays, we are committed to fostering an environment where every child feels valued, represented, and empowered to embrace diversity every day.









GETTING HANDS-ON WITH NATURE: OUTDOOR LEARNING AT BRAYS

Our commitment to hands-on, experiential learning shines through every week during our timetabled Outdoor Learning sessions. Each class enjoys a special time outside where children connect with nature and develop valuable skills.

A favourite part of this experience is caring for our school chickens. Every week, children visit the coop to top up food and water and collect fresh eggs. A special thank you goes to our Lively Lions class, who have taken on the important job of cleaning the chickens each week this half term. Next half term, the responsibility will pass to the Cool Cats—we can't wait to see them in action!

Thanks to the amazing efforts of our community, we now have a dedicated outdoor learning area where children feed the fish and engage in a variety of outdoor activities. This space also offers opportunities for children to help maintain the area, which means lots of sweeping up leaves during this autumn season!

WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

We marked World Mental Health Day with a focus on helping children understand that it's okay to feel all kinds of emotions. We used this important day as an opportunity to teach children about recognising and expressing their feelings in a healthy way.

Our activities linked emotions to the colours of the Zones of Regulation, a tool we use across the school to help children identify how they are feeling and learn strategies to manage those feelings. This visual and practical approach helps children build emotional awareness and self-regulation skills.

Throughout the day, classes explored a wide range of ways to look after both body and mind. Children enjoyed activities such as gentle massage, yoga sessions, and sensory experiences with calming smells. These activities were designed to support relaxation, reduce stress, and promote overall wellbeing.

This half term, we want to give a huge shout-out and heartfelt thanks to Graceful Hands and Mr Lloyd Jones for their wonderful donations to Brays Special School.

The talented volunteers from Graceful Hands have once again amazed us with their creativity and skill, providing unique and incredibly useful resources to support our curriculum. FIRST SPECIAL SCHOOL IN BIRMINGHAM TO ACHIEVE INCLUSIVE ATTENDANCE BRONZE AWARD



We are proud to announce that after a dedicated 7-month commitment to the programme, Brays Special School has been awarded the Inclusive Attendance Bronze Award. This is a significant achievement and makes us the first special school in the whole of Birmingham to receive this recognition.

This award reflects our ongoing commitment to maintaining high attendance standards while supporting the unique needs of our children. It also ensures that our attendance strategy aligns with the law changes introduced in August 2024. Staying within legal requirements is vital for safeguarding our children's right to education.

This success is a true testament to the power of **#teamwork**—between the school, families, and external agencies working closely together. We want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all our families for their continued support and understanding of the school's legal responsibilities around attendance.

The impact of our work is clear: in Autumn 1 2024, children lost 763 days of school due to absence. In Autumn 1 2025, this reduced to 569.5 days. This means children attended school for an extra 193 days—equivalent to one child attending school every day for a full year (190 face-to-face school days).

We are now excited to be working towards the Silver Award as we continue to improve attendance and ensure every child benefits from the full Brays experience.
